



CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION AWARENESS

Overview

This course is designed for health and social care staff, whose main working role is to ensure the safeguarding of children. Training will provide delegates with a strong foundation knowledge of the issues of child sexual exploitation (CSE) as well as ensuring that they develop the ability to identify the signs, indicators, and motivators of exploitation. They will also be given an insight into the impact of CSE and what to do if they have concerns about a child.

2. What is meant by the term 'child sexual exploitation'?
3. Awareness of national guidance, law and frameworks relating to CSE.
4. Understand why every child and young person is vulnerable.
5. Responding to concerns, assessing risk and sharing information.
6. Knowledge of how young people become involved, the grooming process, the impact of the abuse and how young people often respond.
7. The reasons why children may choose not to report incidents of sexual exploitation or abuse

Assessment

Child sexual exploitation awareness training takes 4 hours and delegates may be expected to engage in a number of group activities. Our experienced trainers will be on hand to help guide participants through these sessions and a CPD certificate will be awarded upon completion.
