



RISK ASSESSMENT

This course ensures that delegates are aware of the importance of risk assessments in care environments and that they are equipped with the skills and knowledge required to undertake them appropriately for this specific sector. Training delegates the correct procedure to follow when assessing a service user, premises and its facilities, making sure that they are aware of all relevant law and legislation with which they need to comply. The course is designed for staff who are responsible for providing health and social care to patients, moving & handling risk assessment, but nevertheless, it would be beneficial for anyone who requires a general understanding of risk assessments.

On completion of this course delegates should know and understand the following:

1. Identify the meaning of the term 'risk' and outline the meaning of 'risk assessment'.
2. Recall legislation, policy and guidelines on managing risks to individuals and others.
3. Outline the process of risk assessment and the development of risk management plans.
4. Know the importance of reviewing incidents and learning from them.
5. Know the importance of working with other agencies to manage risks and communicating these risks effectively.
